1. Gain appreciation for impact of pregnancy on normal physiology.
 2. Increase understanding of various pathophysiologic processes in pregnancy.
 3. Observe firsthand the effect of pregnancy on many common medical and surgical problems.
 4. Gain experience in evaluating and managing high-risk obstetric patients in both the inpatient and outpatient settings.
 5. Evaluate and write admission orders for pregnancies complicated by hypertension, diabetes, recurrent urinary tract infectious, incompetent cervix and premature labor.
 6. Develop continuing management and treatment plans for these same patients.
 7. Understand rationale for management of pregnancy complicated by diabetes.
 8. Learn team care approach in management of high-risk patients working with nurses, dietitians and social workers.
 9. Observe and participate in new approaches to fetal diagnosis and therapy.
 10. Gain experience in the presentation of conferences.
